

Remarks on Dearest Family July 25 1843

Com. moved with strong wind from
 the W S W at 1 P.M. the sails hauled
 to the W S W took our anchor
 heading to the West by N. with
 the wind to the SE out of the
 Canal to the N. E. out of the
 Islands Ternback Middle Port Strong
 Current latter part the wind more
 favorable to 8 A.M. took our
 anchor in sailing up the Canal

Wednesday 26

commenced with strong winds from the WSW beating up the bar up the bay at 3 PM came to anchor 20 miles from town middle of latter parts Equinox to ends

Thursday 21

commenced with squally weather
at 1st part I M took our anchor
with the winds to the S.E. W heading
to the N.W to N.W by at 4 P.M. came
to anchor in 30 fathoms of water
middle part strong breeze latter
part at 4 P.M. stood on and then
heading to the S.W with the squalls
the N.W breeze melted.

Friedrich 28

commenced with strong winds from
the NW & W beating to the N.E.
per compass. at 1 P.M. came to
Ancher at 3 or light breeze from
the E.S.E. took our anchor beat
to the South at 5 the wind to the
NW came to Ancher 5 miles from
Town made by light breeze
light winds at 7 P.M. took
our Ancher with the wind to
the NW & W ends beating in for
the harbour at 9 A.M. came to

Andreas came on board
with 4 men & rendered me a
great service in beating in
for the harbor as well.

Statur of Apr. 29

Commenced with moderate winds from
N. the S.W. at 10 p.m. the part of the
line to the anchor with a head
the middle to the anchor with moderate winds
at 1 p.m. the boat over the anchor with the wind
to the S.W. looking in for the harbor
the end.

Sunday April 30

Commenced with light winds from the NW heating in for the harbor at 3 PM. Came to anchor at 5 the wind hauled to the W. took 100 fms. Fishes heading in for the harbor at 6 PM. Came to anchor a breast of the grass in 3 fathoms of water 6 fms bottom. Soil greenish shale mud. 8. 1. 1885. Part. Heavy so ends

beginning with thick fog & weather
leaving at 10 o'clock with a letter post
bag. He gave us 10 dollars & went on
with my papers & my books &
with Prof. H. P. & left my papers
with the American Consul & gave him
a note to take a salary of 1000

Tuesday May 2

Commenced with thick cloudy weather
at 3 P.M. the Yarnes came on Board
to request the Cargo to be taken out
of the Brig at 5 P.M. got more help
from there & within the Brig was here
as to the Landing matters in latter part
thick rainy weather till the arrival of the Y.M.
