Middle Part Gentle Breeze at 8 AM saw a Spinn Whale going quick to the Landward end the Boat with out success Latter Part Fresh Breeze from the ENE Ship under double reefed Top Sails leading on different Tacks Cruising to land these 24 hours employed in mending Sails,

Remarks On Board Saturday March 9th 1839

First Part of these 24 hours Commences with Fresh Breeze from the ENE Ship under Double reefed Top Sails leading on different Tacks Cruising. Middle Part Fresh Breeze & sized at 12 AM saw a school of Spinn Whales land the Boat with out success Latter Part Fresh Breeze from the ENE Ship leading to the SE on a wind under Double reefed Top Sails to land these 24 hours employed in repairing our Sails.

Remarks On Board Sunday March 10th 1839

First Part of these 24 hours Commences with Fresh Breeze from the ENE Ship leading on a Wind to the SE Double reefed Top Sails at 4 PM saw a Sail off the Landward beam, leading to the NW Middle Part Fresh Breeze & Pleasant weather at 8 AM saw a Portuguese Ship (white) English Colors supposed her to be a Merchant Ship Latter Part Gentle Breeze from the ENE Ship leading on a wind to the SE under all Sails, Ship heaving one hundred Strokes an hour to land these 24 hours,

Remarks On Board Tuesday March 12th 1839

First Part of these 24 hours Commences with Fresh Breeze from the ENE & Pleasant weather Ship leading on a wind to the SE under all Sails, Middle Part Gentle Breeze & Pleasant Weather at 4 AM saw a Ship to the North. Latter Part Gentle Breeze from the ENE & Pleasant Weather Ship leading on a Wind to the North under all Sails to land these 24 hours,
