Remarks On Board Saturday May 5th 1839

First Part of these 24 hours Commenced with Gentle Breezes from S by East with Pleasant Weather Steering Ship N N W under all Sail Made Part Gentle Breezes with fine weather at 8 AM saw a Sail to the S N E Latter Part Gentle Breezes from S by East with Pleasant weather Steering Ship S N W under all Sail So Ends these 24 hours Ship being 12 miles in 4 hours
Lat in by Obs 31. 16 S
Long in by Obs 10. 45 E

Remarks On Board Monday May 6th 1839

First Part of these 24 hours Commenced with Gentle Breezes from S by East with Pleasant weather Steering Ship N by W half W Made 8 Latter Part Gentle Breezes from S S E with Pleasant Weather Steering Ship N N W under all Sail one Ship in sight off Starboard bow So Ends these 24 hours Employed in Ships Duty
Lat in by Obs 29. 31 S
Long in by Obs 3. 25 E

Remarks On Board Tuesday May 7th 1839

First Part of these 24 hours Commenced with Fresh Breezes from S S E with Pleasant weather Steering Ship N N W at 4 PM the Ship a head hauled French Colours Made 8 Latter Part Gentle Breezes from S S E with Pleasant Weather Steering Ship N N W under all Sail So Ends these 24 hours Employed in Ships Duty
Lat in by Obs 27. 31 S
Long in by Obs 4. 00 E

Remarks On Board Wednesday May 8th 1839

First Part of these 24 hours Commenced with Gentle Breezes from the S E at Noon saw a large sperm Whale at 2 PM the Boat Landed Boat fastened held the Whale & took it a long side of the Ship 4 PM Made Part Gentle Breezes with Pleasant Weather at 6 AM Commenced Putting on the Whale Latter Part Gentle Breezes from S S E with Pleasant Weather So Ends these 24 hours Employed in Putting on the Whale
 No Obs this day

Remarks On Board Thursday May 9th 1839

First Part of these 24 hours Commenced with Fresh Breezes from W S E with Pleasant Weather Employed in Putting on the Whale at 5 PM got the head off, B Body in but the head by a long side of the Ship through night at 6 AM head rope parted but the head from a long side had a boat made fast to the head set top sail on the Ship worked up to it took it along side at 9 AM Latter Part Gentle Gale from S S E with a heavy sea on So Ends these 24 hours Employed in Putting off the Crib

Remarks On Board Friday May 10th 1839

First Part of these 24 hours Commenced with Gentle Gale from the S S E with a heavy sea running at 4 PM finished Putting in the head made sail on the Ship & steered N N W Made Part Fresh Breezes with a heavy sea running at 6 AM Commenced boiling out our blubber Latter Part Fresh Breezes from S S E with a heavy sea running Steering Ship North So Ends these 24 hours Employed in Boiling
