good day we have had since we left
Lima. It has given us all a chance to
wash and shave and think of our
virtuous wives. It hasn't been nothing
but a gale of wind ever since we left
Good Lord deliver us so ends with fine

Sunday Dec the 13

Throught this whole Light air from the
Southward ship steering by the wind
to the Eastward All hands employed in
fighting the bruth so ends this day

Monday Dec the 14

Throught this 24 hours Light air from the
Southward and pleasant ship steering
by the wind to Eastward with all sail
set to the breeze the watch employed clearing
out the fore hold the cooper making
bootbuckles so ends another fine day

Tuesday Dec the 15

Throught this 24 light air and Calms
the watch employed putting on fresh
Lima by Obs 35° 20'

Long by Chron 32° 15'

Wednesday the 17

Comes in with Light air from S. S. E.
Mild and later part fresh breeze
steering by the wind to Eastward

Lat by Obs 35° 24'

Long by Chron 31° 45'

Thursday Dec the 18

Comes in with light breeze from the Southward
Ship steering by the wind to Eastward
Mild and later part fresh breeze and
Calms so ends another fine day

Lat by Obs 35° 27'

Friday Dec the 19

Throught this 24 hours fresh breezes
from the N. E. ship steering S. S. E.
by compass with all sail set to
the breeze saw two spots and that
was our shear of him so ends
