 At 9 A.M. saw several whales going
 quick to the windward toward the boats

 better next time Later part much the same
 Lat by Obs 35:54.5

Sunday Feb 1
 Throughout this 24 hours Light breeze from
 the Northward and Eastward pleasant Steaming
 S.E. W. saw 10 Humpback and 10 few birds
 And that is about all I think this is
 A fine day as ever shown out of the heavens
 It felt it follow in mind which he has been
 before I if could but this night was my
 virtuous woman And pour out my feelings
 of sorrow to her for could not with any more
 my watch below Good Lat by Obs 34:19.5

February Monday Feb 1 1847
 All this 24 hours Light air and
 Calms saw nothing in the whole time
 but A few Whales and birds the
 Cooper employed making vent-spikes
 this day is my birth day. I think
 about 26. I hope if for I think
 if we don't get sea oil before long
 I shall be 27 some sweet time
 Lat by Obs 39:29.5
 Long by Obs 53:24.0

February Feb 2 1847
 Throughout this 24 hours Light air and
 Calms At 9 A.M. saw Humpbacks heard
 the boats the west boat struck and
 ground in coming on board captured
 three porpoises and one sunfish so we
 got a drop to have a last so ends
 Lat by Obs 40:28.5

Wednesday Feb 3
 Comes in with Light air and Calms
 Middle and Later part Light breezes
 from the S.E. Steaming by the wind
 to the S.W. saw killers and plants
 of birds the Cooper employed Greeting
 his saw so ends Lat by Obs 40:40.5

Thursday Feb 4
 Commences with Light air from the S.E.
 Steaming S.E. W. by compass saw sports
 Doughtful Middle and Later much the
 same the watch employed mending sails
 Lat by Obs 41:50.5

Friday Feb 5
 Comes in with Light air from the N.E.
 Steaming S.E. W. Middle part Cloud to
 the S.E. Later part fresh breezes
 the Cooper employed sandalizing drawers
 so ends kinder could Lat by Obs 43:0.5
