 from the South and East
 Ship under short sail Lat by Obs 50:00
 Long by Chron 63:58

Friday 15th
 Calms in with strong gales from
 the N.W. strong S.W. Middle part
 then moderate saw a finback and
 plenty of birds Later part light breeze
 and pleasant Lat by Obs 54:45
 Long by Chron 64:15

Saturday 16th
 Calms in with Calms Middle part light
 breeze from the North strong S by W
 saw a great quantity of finbacks and
 birds Later part strong breezes
 Another Calm with West by North
 to morning and N. westerly fair
 Good Lat by Obs 52:53
