Throught this 24 hours steering breezes from
the N.E. steering W. by N. 1/2 N. the watch employed
steering guns. Lat by the 12:49 a.m.
Long by Chron 129:22 a.m.

Tuesday the 13
All this 24 hours breezes from the N.E.
steering W. by N. 1/2 N. Captain's one passenger
Lat by the 13:42 a.m.

Wednesday the 14
All this 24 hours fine breezes from the
N.E. steering W. by N. 1/2 N. the watch
employed fitting the boats. Lat by the 14:19 a.m.
Long by Chron 138:28 a.m.
