April 21 1847 there is nothing of much  
account from the day we arrived to the  
day we left the west we hear to get  
what the whalers call refreshments that is  
to see the Ladies. And get some packages  
they are very convenient they will put you  
on to the point for one real they are very  
good looking. Except they will be good  
the land in sight

Wednesday 21  
Comes in with light breezes from the  
N. by E steering by the wind to the Northward  
and weather Middle part Light Breezes  
Later part much the same so Good  
Lat by Obs 21140 N

Thursday 22  
Comes in with light breezes from the N. by E  
steering by the wind to the Northward with  
all sail sent to the breezes Middle part Later  
breezes the Cooper employed repairing could haul  
the watch repairing the cold boat so Good  
Lat by Obs 23115 N  
Long by Obs 15710 W

Friday 23  
The first part of these 24 hours Calms  
Middle and Later part Light air from the  
Northward with squalls of rain so Good  
Lat by Obs 23120 N
