

June 26 1847

Throught this 24 hours strong breeze from the
Northward steering by the wind to the Northward
under about said the deeper employed making
Downscreeps. It was not quite so pleasant as it
was 2 years ago. At this time I saw Phalarope
Beet. I hope there is better days. I commenced
So Ends saw nothing in the whole line

Wednesday 25

Throught this 24 hours fine weather. At 2 P.M.
saw one white whale. Saw but to see purpose
At 4 P.M. saw land bearing N.W. and
A great quantity of finches. plenty of
birds. So Ends
Lat by the 58:16 N
Long by the 144:58 W

Thursday 26

Came in with fine weather the land in sight
At 9 A.M. saw 2 white whale. Saw
the most boat struck and killed took
some Norway side but birds in school
saw to make 50 lbs. Good case year
ago this night I saw Phalarope so Ends
With strong breeze under short sail

Friday 27

Throught this 24 hours strong gales from
the Eastward. And many N.W. birds employed
In the hours of morning they there is a vast
difference between last year at this time
I live in hope that there is better days coming

June 26 1847

Came in with strong breeze from the S.E.
With 2 heavy swell under short sail the watch
employed sweeping here saw great quantity of
finches. Later part more moderate so Ends
With bad management and saw many others as
one sail in sight
Lat by the 58:16 N
Long by the 144:58 W

Sunday 27

Came in with strong breeze from the Eastward
At 4 P.M. commenced sweeping the scumper down
Middle part the wind hauled to the North still
blowing on. At 9 P.M. fresh the ship Margaret
of Warren two years out 1200 hundred lbs.
Later part heavy gales with 2 thick rain
storm. Could hear for the night so Ends
the Captains will right in God

Monday 28

Came in with strong gales from the North
Sweeping the under 2 that reach main top sail
Middle part more moderate commenced sweeping
the scumper down many. Later part finches
turned up so Ends saw three ships so Ends

Tuesday 29

Came in with strong breeze and foggy
Middle part more moderate saw great
quantity of birds and finches. Later part
light breeze from the S.W. steering to
the Northward in company with the
Margaret of Warren. Gaining
Lat by the 58:30 N
