on shore to cut wood up to his store
in sand and water for the Captive
to take to the Sandwich Islands
part of the crew after turtle
He saw three humpbacked whales
that was our shore of these

October the 26 this day part of the
men on shore working the rest
fitting the boats the Cooper it works

October 27 this day two boats went
over to the island to see the Greenland
Island spend the night on shore
trotter the Cooper at work

October the Boats has arrived from the
Sailing party loaded with Oysters and
turtles the Cooper has 10 fathom next

Sunday October 28 this last three or four days
the boats has been working. All ways for pleasure
I went on shore this morning but fish
three buckets the most beautiful. Oysters
I got one saw one ship in sight. It came in

Monday November 1 took our Anchor from
Carter bay shifted into Glau bay one ship arrived
the Port of Greenland 18 months out 300 hundred

Tuesday 2 Highed Anchor hauled off shore
In six fathoms of water the boats trying all
ways giving good fishing

November 3 Light breeze from N.W.

At 8 P.M. Got under weigh and ran down
the bay 10 miles over the sand bluff
the proper place for whaling 3 fathoms
of water

November 4 Strongy breezes from N.W.
Ship lying at Anchor as usual several
people on board from shore employed
in ships duty some work

November 5 Strongy breezes from N.W.
two boats after turtle at 5 P.M. returned
with 18 remainder part of the people
variously employed in ships duty some work

November 6 Strongy gales from N.W.
All hands on board variously employed
No other jobs Nothing new

November the 7 Strongy gales from N.W.
two boats variously passing off and on
the shore several people from the boats
on board
