

November 11 Strong gales from N^W

November 10 Light breezes from the North

November 13 strong breezes from N^W
At 9 A M took the anchor and ran one
mile down the bay 1 boat on shore after
lectures the rest employed the blacksmith
repairing the wheel 30 miles

November 14 Light breezes from N^W
two boats D scouring the bay, At one P M
five men and one from shore took
from the ship the Starboard bow boat
Took left At 5 P M sent 1 boat in pursuit
suppose them to be going to the Cape
by what once heard 30 miles in chase

November 15 Gentle breezes from north
At 5 P M the two pleasure boats returned
from the island with turtle and oysters
four ships lying near as usual waiting
for whales to come into the bay

November 16 Light breezes from N^W
Allhands on board D mending their
Boats as each the day

November 17 Light breezes with Calm the
Boat not returned that is in pursuit of the
mureys several sparrows on board for the
purpose of trading brought from the shore
the blacksmith & I

November 18 strong breezes from N^W
Allhands employed in ships duty
At 11 A M arrived the ship Super
of providence which being lost away
60 miles up the coast on Friday the 15
of this month sailed a total loss of the
Gangway Allhands saved from fellows
