 This day took our anchor from Margaret Bay. Discovering our stay bar we obtained 80 45 lbs of oil 80 30 lbs from the racks of the ship hope at 25 cts per lb and several other articles such as flour tallowlines shavers sails blocks chains etc. And sheets. And steered out of the bay S S W and S W. When clear steered W by S for the sandwich islands. All is well.

Sunday February the 20
 Strong breezes from N W ship on the wind to the N S W. And S W by W with a heavy swell from the N W. Saw several humpbacks the ship set on of sugarharbour in company.

Monday February 21 1848
 Strong Gale from N W steering by the wind to the S W by W all sail set to. Saw some humpbacks. Lat by obs 22:28

Tuesday February 22 1848
 Light breezes from N N E steering W S W with all sail set to the breeze this night brack weather made the steamer sit on in company.
 Lat by obs 21:23
 Long by Chron 119:47

Wednesday 23. All this 24 hours Light Breezes from N N E steering W S W the steamer in company the Captain on board to spend the day the watch employed making spare parts. And skunt.
 Lat 21:9
 Long 119:50

Thursday February 24 1848
 Light airs from the Northward And Easterly steering W S W in company with the steamer saw one finback the watch employed at various things. Lat by obs 24:37
 Long 122:15

Friday February 25
 Breezes in with light airs from N E steering W by S saw humpbacks one finback. Later part strong Breezes the steamer in company.

Saturday February 26
 Strong Gale from the Southward And Easterly steering to the Westward part of the time saying two under 10 shot reef main topsail the steamer in company.

Sunday February 27
 Strong Gale from the S W steering on our tack under short sail head winds and plenty of rain which makes hard looks. O my Charmer if I could but this night I leave on my knees to God. Another Sabbath some D talking about your wife and my daughter. Lat by obs 21:09
