Northward. Several Heistons N. 9 D. M.
Saw 1 humpback and found but no
one pursued the watch in the night. It
was very dark the paper on N. Fenlon

Long by Chron 143: 56

Saturday April 22
Light breeze from N. N. E. steering
by the wind to Northward North
Westward saw several humpbacks
and killed the cold Bore the third
day 10 months but Lat by Obs 23: 00.00
Long by Chron 141: 44 E

Sunday April 23
Light breezes from N. E. steering
N. W. by N. saw two humpbacks 30 birds.
Northward about 100 the conversation
is about home sweet home Lat by Obs 24: 00
Long by Chron 139: 49

Monday April 24
Throught this 24 hours light breeze and calm
saw one bird Lat by Obs 25: 00.00
Long by Chron 138: 35

Tuesday April 25
Light breeze and calm continued one humpback
Lat by Obs 25: 44

Wednesday April 26 1846
All this 24 hours light breeze and calm
from all parts of the compass saw humpbacks
more growing about the yard Lat by Obs 26: 30.00

Thursday April 27
Throught this 24 hours light breeze from N. E.
steering N. W. by compass saw humpbacks
Lat by Obs 27: 30.00
Long by Chron 136: 15 E

Friday April 28
Throught this 24 hours fresh breezes from S. E.
steering N. W. saw several humpbacks
Lat by Obs 28: 50.00
Long by Chron 134: 22 E

Saturday April 29
First part comes in with strong breezes
from the southward steering N. W. by N.
later part of rain and somewhat
killed the cold Bore Lat by Obs 29: 49.00

Sunday April 30
Have been in the latitude 30 North in which
rain storm trying to find the passage in the
Japanese sea between Amoy and here we shall
have out wind from all parts of the compass
N. E.
The 31 it thick rain storm
