Sunday May 28
 Calm in with fine Breezes from the S.E.
 Steaming N.W. Middle part rainy saw
 several humpbacks saw two ships one off
 then Steaming to the southward Later part
 fine (very) whenever it could but this
 light breeze out my feelings of sorrow
 which your devoted and sincere wishes have
 this day I have about give up all hopes
 of ever getting a full ship

Monday May 29
 Calm in with light breezes from S.E.
 Steaming to the Westward At 9 P.M.
 saw Ed sail on her last voyage because
 found her dead and broke the Church's bark
 of New Bedford 7 or 8 this season Captain
 Burdett went on board and spent the
 day Middle part Breeze Steaming to the
 Westward in Company Later part more
 Breeze

Tuesday May 30 1846
 Calm in with light Steaming by the Wind
 to the Westward Middle and Later part foggy
 with fresh breezes over one ship

Wednesday May 31
 This night this 24 hours fine Breezes and
 pleasant Steaming to the Northward saw one
 Whale land but to no purpose saw one
 Bird going quick to windward At 4 P.M.
 saw Sarah Baring N.W. by S. Breeze with
 fine weather and no Whales Lat by Obs 40:58
 Long by Chron 131:40

Thursday June 1
 This night this 24 hours Light Winds and
 soft weather plenty off fog and on rain
 Steaming to the Eastward saw one Bird
 Lat by Obs 41:28
 Long by Chron 135:08

Friday June 2
 All this 24 hours strong Winds and Light
 Breezes the wind with N.W. it thick foggy
 broke the ship owner of New Bedford
 8 Whales this season the Lat by Obs 41:41

Saturday June 3
 All this 24 hours Light Breeze with N.W. wind
 fog saw two ships one dead whale Lat
 by clock the killed it thing they to say
 they call it a long it looks more
 like a porpoise
