Saw one Bird one seal two Harke Dead
Whale Lost their Jackets Don't forget the
Peppersacks please
Lat by 40° 39' 32"
Long by 40° 13' 19"

Friday June 16
All this 24 hours fine saw whales Land
Three times At last the Bombard struck
killed the Cow and calf took them
Along side Surtouch sail Lat by 40° 39' 53"

Saturday June 17
Shrouglet this 24 hours Calms At 4 Commencet
Cutting At 12 M finished so Ends Commencet
Boysling the Coopers first Hatch in Good
Lat by 40° 39' 49"

Sunday June 18
Shrouglet this 24 hours Light this Part
Calms At 6 A M saw 10 dead Whale
Land took him Along side Cut him in
Lost the Bone suppose the Stockport to
be 55 lbs so Ends Boysling Good
Lat by 40° 39' 59"

Monday June 19
All this 24 hours Light this Part Calms Steaming
By the wind Boysling At 4 A M saw whales
Land put to sea purpose finished Boysling the
Shrouglet 5 A M
Lat by 40° 31' 34"

Tuesday June 20
Shrouglet this 24 hours Light this Part Calms
At 6 A M saw Whales Land put to sea purpose
Boysling
Lat by 40° 59'

Wednesday June 21
Comes with fresh breezes Steaming by the wind
to the Northward saw great many of Whales
Going quick Land once but to sea purpose
Saw five ships two Boysling the Bombard
is it Boysling
At 4

Thursday June 22
Comes in with Calms breezy Middle Part Later
part Light breezes saw great many of
Whales Land Struck two and took the
Saw one went off the another Land
Came on Board then heard the rest
At 5 ships in sight Boysling Dead
Whaling the Bombard finished Boysling

Friday June 23
Shrouglet this 24 hours Breezy saw Whaling
Whales two ought to Land saw one ship
Boysling Home Sweet Home
Lat by 40° 34'
