

Saturday June 24 1845  
Thirteenth, this 24 hours stormy Breeze And  
Thick With sharp Lightning Saw Whales two  
singed to Lard saw two ships All hands  
employed in the Arms of ropes etc etc

Sunday June 25  
All this 24 hours Light Air And Calm for ships  
in sight At 4 P.M. We saw Another Stuckpot  
We took him Along side Got him in  
Suppose him to weigh 80 lbs the Lard is on  
low side this time Good Lat by Obs 41° 08'

Monday June 26  
Thirteenth this 24 hours fine Weather Subsident  
At 4 P.M. saw Whales Lard, Stuckpot killed  
He went to Str rise in air, so Ends  
the Bowditch is A Boyling I hope better  
Luck to morrow Lat by Obs 41° 39'

Tuesday June 27  
All this 24 hours fine weather Saw whales  
Lard but to see further, finest Boyling  
Sprake A member ship 600 lbs  
Lat by Obs 39° 45'

Wednesday June 28  
Favouring lat. this 24 hours Calm And  
stormy Breeze With A thick  
fog All hands employed Storing down  
etc etc

Thursday June 29 1845  
Comes in With A thick fog strong Breeze saw  
Whales Lard but to see further Came on board  
finest Storing so Ends All hands in A bad groove  
the Cooper setting up shovels

Friday June 30  
Comes With A heavy thunder storm. Middle  
Part subsident saw one Whale the fog  
thick in two thick to Lard so Ends under  
Short sail the Cooper setting up shovels  
Lat by Obs 42° 20'  
Long by Obs 156° 05'

Saturday July 1  
All this day fine Good Luck two Whales  
Suppose them to weigh 180 lbs Lat by Obs 42° 39'

Sunday July 2  
At daylight Commenced Sailing At 10 A.M.  
finest fine weather saw Whales Lard  
but to see further so Ends Boyling  
With A thick fog Lat by Obs 42° 35'

Monday July 3  
Fine weather plenty of Whales Lard  
took the third whale for this month  
Commenced Sailing Last down for the  
night Boyling
