Sunday July 16
All this 24 hours thick fog Wind Calms
Whales in the View of Wharves
All well, and hear is my wife and your
Daughter so ends another Sabbath
No Obs

Monday July 17
Throughout this 24 hours Calms with N thick
fog finished string the Gearboard the
Cooper setting up shovels No Obs

Tuesday July 18
Comes in from Whales heard but to no purpose
Middle Wind later part fog speak the
Morse of Mistake 13 months out 3000 lbs
the Cooper at work shovels No Obs

Wednesday July 19 1846
All this 24 hours fine weather saw Whales
heard but to no purpose saw two ships
speak the Charrington of Westtown Captain
Parker for this season the Land in sight
Distance 20 miles so ends another day
With bad management Heaven help us
the Cooper on 10 furlow Lat by Obs 43:13
Long by Chron 137:11 E

Thursday July 20
Comes in with strongy Breezes from the Westward
steering by the wind to Southward Middle Wind
later part pleasant saw nothing in the
whale line Bad Management of my Wharves
if could but this night Lat by Obs 42:14
Long by Chron 136:24

Friday July 21
All this 24 hours Light Winds Wind Calms During
Breeze saw nothing Lat by Obs 42:15
Long by Chron 136:02

Saturday July 22
Comes in with N thick fog Wind Calms at
12 M speak the ship Long Adams of
Liverpool 28 Barretts out 2500 lbs for the season
later part strongy Gales with rain fine
ships in sight one Boysing No Obs

Throughout this 24 hours strongy Gales during
saw three ships
