

Monday July 24 1868
Comes in with strong breezes with 20 heavy
swell At 4 o'clock we saw 20 Dead whales
on our weather beam Landed two boats At
12 M took him Commenced cutting At 6
finest Dearest of 20 time with 20 heavy
swell saw 2 ships on 20 Bayside 20 Cows
Bayling 20 Stockpot 1 Lat by 46° 42' 23"

Tuesday 25
Thought this 24 hours strong winds and
light breezes plenty of fog and rain
Bayling Dearest of 20 time 20 is over did
see saw three ships the Cooper 20 night in

Wednesday July 26
Comes in fine finest Bayling the Stockpot
Made 25 fells At 9 o'clock saw whales Landed
but to no purpose saw four ships speak
the Cooper of Mistake 22 whistles out
200 fells the Land Distance 40 miles
Later part thick fog and rain
the Cooper Whaling Lat by 46° 42' 23"

Thursday July 27
All this 24 hours rain and fog saw no
Whale too thick to low Lat 46° 46'

Friday 28 Comes in with Calms and
pleasant the Land Distance 25 miles
Later part light breezes saw 20 Dead whales
Landed two him Alongside but in 20
small part of him About 20 fells
saw five ships At 46°

Saturday July 29 1868
Thought this 24 hours light breezes Calms
and fog saw the Land Distance Bayling the
Stockpot Made 25 fells At 46°

Sunday July 30
Comes in with light breeze Steaming to the North
and East with 20 thick fog Middle Dead
Later part pleasant 20 Cows Another Calm
Lat by 46° 45' 21"
Long by 136° 34'

Monday July 31
Comes in with strong breezes from N.W.
Steaming N.E. by 6 pleasant saw several whales
Later part moderate Lat by 46° 46'
Long by 136° 43'

Tuesday August 1
Thought this 24 hours light breeze from
the West Steaming N.E. saw one whale
Whale going quick Landed but to no purpose
the New New Bound for Coast to fill up
in about one week however sent it
back Management Bad Management
saw one ship on Landed quarter
the Cooper is about half full to Marine
is about today Lat by 46° 45'
Long by 136° 42'
