 Middle part thick with smoke lighting
 Later part Calms and pleasant weather
 Secured out of the beams the Cooper taking
 his boots & my Charmer if I could but
 this night Heaven calms breezes
 Lying down Lat by 44:20

Saturday Jan 20
 Light breeze and Calms Later part Light
 breezes from S.W. and pleasant steering
 N by E saw about many of finbacks
 the Captain growling about the grub
 this thought was heard blunder Gingerbread
 I think the Captain will loose Deal
 Lat by 43:30
 Long by 50:30

Sunday Jan 21
 Light breezes from S.W. steering N by E
 Middle part Calms Later part squally
 With heavy thunder and lightning
 Strong breeze under Double reef topsails
 Saw several right whales so quick another
 Sabbath with a head wind if my
 virtuous woman knew how I felt she
 I think she would pray for me
 Lat 40:34

Monday Jan 22
 Fresh breezes from the N.W. steering by the
 wind to the N.E. Middle part fresh wind
 hauled to the S.W. and sail staked N by E
 Set all the stowage pleasant Lat point
 Calms saw two ships and about Lat 42:22
 many right whales Long 49:30

Tuesday Jan 23
 All this day fresh breezes from N.E. steering
 by the wind Northward and Westward the
 Cooper did work making buckets all hands
 fells down squally Lat by 41:46
 Long by 49:43

Wednesday Jan 24
 First part Calms and fine going round and round
 Later part fresh breezes from S.W. steering
 N.W. with all sail sent to the breeze caught
 two porpoises we have got a fair wind
 once more thank heaven Lat by 41:56

Thursday Jan 25
 Fresh breezes from S.E. steering N.W. &
 Middle part and Later strong breezes
 With a thick rain storm fair wind
 N.W.

Friday Jan 26
 Strong breezes from S.E. with squalls of rain
 steering N.W. & Middle and Later part
 fine weather with a fair wind
 Spoke the ship masters of Hatterick
 two months from home so far from
 Lat by 34:50
 Long by 46:59

Saturday 27
 Light breezes from S.E. steering
 N.W. & Middle part Calms Later
 part Light breezes from N.E. with
 Light squalls of rain Lost ball
 Lat 36:43
