 Strong breezes from N^W to S^W
 Middle and Lower part strong gales
 Steering N^W from that to S^W
 Lat by Obs 29:45
 Long by Obs 36:52

Friday February 7th
 All this 24 hours strong gales from S^W
 Steering N^W from that to S^W the
 Cooper made one Draw bucket hard work
 Lat by Obs 27:23
 Long by Obs 33:00

Saturday Feb 8th
 All this 24 hours strong gales from S^W
 Steering N^W with squalls of rain
 Saw 11 ships steering to the S^W in the
 Main topsailsail in

Sunday Feb 9th
 Strong gales from S^W steering from
 about N^W to S^W Later part wind shifted
 to the North sailing slowly steering
 with plenty of rain ships under close
 reef topsails head wind. Again

Monday Feb 10th
 Strong gales from the North with
 heavy squalls of rain part the time
 under double reef and part with
 the fore and main topsails in ship
 heading to the Eastward so much with
 a wet jacket plenty of wash water
 Lat by Obs 27:45

Tuesday February 11th 1849
 Throughout this 24 hours strong breezes and
 light breezes calm squalls of rain from
 N^W to S^W steering on way tack to go
 to the Northward so much weather Sabbath
 with plenty of fresh water No Obs

Wednesday Feb 12th
 Light breezes from the N^W steering on
 the Northward tack Middle part light
 wind more to the North tackest ship
 Later part calm the watch employed
 at various jobs the Cooper making
 Block so much weather Long day
 warm Lat by Obs 26:23
 Long by Obs

Thursday Feb 13th
 All this 24 hours light Air and calm
 with light squalls of rain steering on
 tack saw for sail Lat by Obs 20:00
 Long by Obs 33:28

Friday Feb 14th
 Light breezes from N^W steering by the
 wind with light squalls of rain
 Middle and Lower part strong breeze
 steering on tack the watch employed
 at various jobs the Cooper washing
 his Child down saw one sail
 so much weather day with 10 head
 wind and sand bars Lat by Obs 19:20
