February 27
 Comes in with strong Breezes from N.W.
 steering by the wind N.W. & thick rain
 storm. Middle part wind from the south
 thick later part Light Breezes and
 pleasant steering. N.W. & the Cooper
 employed Drifting about the Beach House

February 28
 All this day fresh breezes from south
 steering N.W. & the watch employed
 repairing sails the Cooper Making
 the furrers Cook the Captain Making
 to Cook Another winter
 Lat by Lat 35:15
 Long by Chron 165:15

March 1
 All this 24 hours strong Breezes from the
 South steering N.W. & Clear the Cooper
 Mending his old stockings to Cook
 Cook Charmer if I could But this
 Night Glory Hark Sweet Home
 Lat by Lat 32:28
 Long by Chron 166:00

March 2
 Comes in with strong Breezes from the south
 steering N.W. & the watch part strong
 Gales. At 12 M saw Kongsuck island
 bearing West Distance 20 miles later
 part heavy Gales and plenty off
 rain sailing under the cloth reef
 Main top sail split the fore sail
 Dressed up to time to Cook Blowing
 the screamer this is in place like
 a horse I think I had rather be
 a shoveler than to be here to night
 - Lat by Lat 29:11

March 3
 Comes in with strong Gales from
 the south steering N.W. & the watch
 and later part fine and pleasant
 Lat by Lat 26:39

March 4
 Throughout this 24 hours fine weather
 Light Breezes from S.W. steering
 N.W. & the Cooper employed mending
 the furrers Cook to Cook Another day
 I should like to have seen the
 Shampan that he has been down
 to day that is my dear Glory
 Lat by Lat 26:26
