

Remarks on Board

Saturday November the 30th Lying at Anchor
all the 24 hours light breeze and warm pleasant weather
the crew employed cleaning the ship out side & washing the oil
at 10 AM, Arrived Barge Emma of New Bedford 43 months
1100 bbls

At Anchor December the first 1850
all this day light air and warm pleasant weather, at 9 AM
let the principle part of the crew go on liberty

At Anchor Monday Dec^r the 2nd the first part
wind variable and heavy showers of rain the remainder
of the day fresh trades and fair weather, took on board
A raft Water and one load of Wood and Seven bbls of Yams

At Anchor Tuesday December the 3rd
all this day strong trades and fair weather all hands
employed taking the rigging, bundling Bone & took on board
Six bbls of Yams and one Boat Load of Wood
Note, this day Ship Charles Rodgers. A native of Brew, France

At Anchor Wednesday December the 4th
all this day strong trades and pleasant weather
all hands employed taking the rigging getting Wood &
took on board one load of Wood and one bbl Yams,

At anchor Thursday December the 5th
all this day fresh trades and fine weather all hands employed
getting Wood & Water & stowing it below, at 5 AM Charles Rodgers
entered himself to Duty

Friday December the 6th At Anchor
the first part of this day light variable breezes with rain
the latter part calm and cloudy all hands employed getting Wood
and stowing down Water

At Anchor December the 7th
the first of this day baffling air and rainy the latter part
light trades and pleasant weather the crew employed
hauling and stowing Wood

At Anchor Sunday December the 8th

all this day fresh trades
with occasional rain squalls, at 8 AM let the principle part
of the crew go on shore on liberty, at 5 PM Paul Ripple
came on board Drunk, & began making a disturbance forward
when I went there to stop the noise, he Paul Ripple, drawing
A Sheath Knife in his hand threatened to stop me with it
when I clinched him and Mr Barrus the 3rd officer took the
knife from him and gave it over board, when I took him
aft and by the Capt orders seized him in the Mizzen rigging
and the Capt gave him 8 lashes with A piece of seizing staff
at 6 PM William Steers, threatened to take Mr. Munkers
life when the Capt seized him up to the Mizzen rigging and gave
him ten lashes & put A pair of hand cuffs on him and put
him down in the run, at 7 PM John Peters, Benjamin Essex,
Sybester Littlefield & Robert Devol, have not come on board
at 9 PM all hands on board,

At Anchor Monday December the 9th
all this day baffling winds with heavy showers of rain
took on board two loads of Wood

Tuesday December the 10th At Anchor
the first part of this day strong trades and fair weather
employed stowing Wood and blacking the bands, the latter part
squally and took off A load of Wood.

Wednesday December the 11th At Anchor
all these 24 hours light trades and fair weather
the crew employed with sundry jobs took on board
Eight bbls of Yams, at 2 PM arrived Ship Barclay
of Nantucket 38 months 1000 bbls.

Thursday December the 12th At Anchor

all this day light breeze & fair weather at 10 AM took off
A raft of Water and began to black the beam

Friday December the 13th at Anchor
all this day wind variable with occasional rain squalls
all hands employed with sundry jobs about the ship
