

Remark, While at Anchor at Victoria, Hong Kong

Tuesday January the 14th 1851

All this day fresh breezes and pleasant cold weather, all hands employed painting the masts and with sundry jobs about the ship.

Wednesday January the 15th

All this day fresh breezes and pleasant weather. Employed painting the larboard side of the ship at 3 P.M. Charles Rogers was sent on board by the Counsel having been on shore the past 24 hours and during the time having entered a complaint against the Captain.

Thursday January the 16th

This day commences with fresh breezes and fair weather all hands employed painting the boats and repairing sails. The latter part of the day it drizzled rain.

Friday January the 17th

All this day light baffling air with fair weather, at 8 A.M. let the Starboard Watch go on liberty for 24 hours the larboard watch painting boats &c.

Saturday January the 18th

All this day fresh breezes and with fine pleasant weather, the larboard watch on liberty for 24 hours, the watch employed repairing the main top sail.

Sunday January the 19th

All this day strong trades and cool weather at 8 A.M. the Starboard Watch went on liberty for 24 hours.

Monday Jan^y the 20th

All this day light breezes and fine weather the larboard watch on liberty for 24 hours the Starboard Watch repairing sails.

Tuesday Jan^y the 21st

All this day strong breezes and fair weather the Starboard Watch on liberty for 24 hours the Larboard Watch repairing sails.

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Wednesday Jan^y 22nd

All this day light breezes and fine pleasant weather, the watch employed drying some the Larboard Watch on liberty for 24 hours.

Thursday Jan^y the 23rd

The first part of this calm and cloudy the latter part calm & pleasant all hands employed drying and bundling bone, waiting for the ship to take the oil & bone.

Friday Jan^y the 24th

All this day light breezes from the West with passing clouds, this day shipped on board the English ship Hugh Walker 243 Bundles of Bone Weighing 28,413 lbs. and Barge Mount Walliston with 8000 Bundles.

Saturday Jan^y the 25th

All this day light breezes and fair weather the Starboard Watch on liberty, at 4 P.M. the ship Hugh Walker came alongside to take in oil on freight to London.

Sunday Jan^y the 26th

All this day fresh breezes and fair weather. No word on board Sunday, the Larboard Watch on liberty. Edward Saunders belonging to the Starboard Watch has not returned on board and it is reported that he is in Prison.

Monday Jan^y the 27th

All this day strong trades and fair weather, at 6.30 A.M. commenced hoisting up the oil to put on board the Hugh Walker, at 1 P.M. set hooked up the takers having put on board 242 Bbls. Edward Saunders has not returned on board.

Tuesday Jan^y the 28th

All this day baffling breezes and fine weather, all hands employed discharging the oil at 3 P.M. finished putting on board 74 Bbls. Gauging 13012 gallons, Branded S.B. &c. at 4 P.M. Edward Saunders was brought on board by the Police, and went to duty.
