

Remarks while on the Passage to the Ochotsk Sea,

Thursday July the 31st

Commences with a fresh gale from the N.E. and rugged heavy weather, at 2 P.M. kept off S by E, and let the reef out of the top sails and set the main top gallant sail. Steering along the land to the Southward, at 12 M. Cape Kops. bearing S.W. and kept the ship S.W. with a fresh gale from the N.E. and some rain, at 3 A.M. passed a Bark lying too under close reefed main top sail at 6th hauled up S.S.W. the latter part the wind more moderate with rain at 11 A.M. set the fore and mizen top gallant sails.

Lat by Act 62.50 North Long by Act 173.00 West

Friday July the, Friday August the 1st

Commences with a fresh gale from the N.E. and Drizzly weather, at 2 P.M. the wind hauled to the East, same time hauled up South and set the main sail & jib at 12 M. N. the wind hauled back to the N.E. same time kept off S.S.W. the latter part strong breezes with passing clouds at 8 A.M. made the West head Lat by Act 60.40 North Long by Chron 172.16 East

Saturday August the 2^d

Commences with a strong breeze from the E.N.E. with fair weather the ship with all prudent sail set steering S.W. by S, at 4 P.M. more moderate and set the Starboard fore top mast Studding sail, at 8 P.M. the wind hauled to the North, same time kept the ship S.W. by W. and shifted the Studding sail to the Starboard, the middle part strong breeze with Drizzly weather, at 8 A.M. increasing breezes and took in the Studding sail, ends with a strong breeze from the North with rugged rainy weather. Lat by Act 58.30 North Long by Act 155.00 East

Sunday August the 3^d

Commences with a strong breeze from the North with rugged rainy weather, the ship with all prudent sail set steering S.W. by W, at 6 P.M. kept off S.W. by S at 12 M. N. the wind hauled to the W.N.W. and moderating same time set the flying jib and fore top mast Studding sail at 4 A.M. the wind hauled to the West, took in the Studding sail and braced sharp heading S.S.W. the latter part a light breeze and fair weather. Nothing of the Whale kind Lat by Act 57.03 North Long by Chron 172.17 East

Remarks on Board

Monday August the 4th

Commences with a light breeze from the Westward with fair weather, the ship with all sail set steering S.W. by S, at 5 P.M. the breeze hauled to the North and at 9 P.M. kept off South, and at 4 A.M. hauled up S.W. by W, the latter part a light air from the Westward and cloudy inclining to a calm Lat by Act 56.04 North Long by Chron 170.40 East

Tuesday August the 5th

Commences calm and cloudy weather, at 6 P.M. took a breeze from the S.W. and braced sharp on the Starboard tack heading S.S.E. with all sail set through the night the wind hauling gradually to the West the latter part a fresh breeze from the W. by S and fair the ship heading S by W with all sail set Lat by Act 54.51 North Long by Chron 170.31 East

Wednesday August the 6th

Commences with a fresh breeze from the W. by S and fair weather the ship by the wind with all sail set heading S by W, at 8 P.M. set in foggy at 11 tacked to the S.S.W., at 2 A.M. the wind hauled to the S.W., and tacked ship to the W.S.W. the middle and latter part moderate breezes and a thick fog Lat by Act 54.10 North Long by Act 169.30 East

Thursday August the 7th

Commences with a moderate breeze from the S.W. and thick foggy weather, the ship with all sail set heading W.S.W. through the night strong breezes from the W.S.W., at 1 A.M. furled the flying jib, the latter part strong breezes from the W.S.W. and foggy at intervals, the ship by the wind heading to the South, Lat by Act 52.20 North Long by Act 166.30 East

Friday August the 8th

Commences with a strong breeze from the W.S.W. and foggy at intervals, ship by the wind heading South at 11 P.M. the wind veered to the S.W. same time tacked ship to the W.N.W. through the night strong breezes and a thick fog, the latter part more moderate with fog Lat by Act 53.00 North Long by Act 165.45 East
