

Remarks while on the Passage Home.
Sunday February the 15th 1852

Commences with a strong breeze from the North and Drizzly weather, the ship with all prudent sail set standing by the wind to the S.W. from 6 to 10 P.M. the wind veered to the West, kept the ship S.W. & set the larboard Studding sail, through the night a light air and Drizzly, the latter part a light breeze and fine weather the breeze veering to the Southward, at 12 M. hauled up S.W. by S. Lat by Obs 56.08 South, Long by Chron 63.40 West

Monday February the 16th

Commences with a light breeze from the N.W. and fine pleasant weather, the ship with all Drawing sail set steering S.W. by S. at 9 P.M. the breeze hauled to the S.W. through the night a light breeze from the S.W. and fine weather at 4 A.M. the wind hauled back to the N.W. and set the Studding sail at 7 passed a Merchant Bark, steering S.W., the latter part a brisk breeze veering to the West with Drizzly weather, Course S.W. by S. Lat by Obs 55.00 South, Long by Obs 60.10 West.

Tuesday February the 17th

Commences with a brisk breeze from the West and Drizzly weather, the ship with all Drawing sail set steering S.W. by S. at 9 P.M. strong breezes from S.W. kept off S.W. by S. and set the Starboard main top gallant Studding sail the middle part strong breezes and fair weather, the latter part increasing breezes from W.S.W. and cloudy Lat by Obs 53.20 South, Long by Obs 56.50 West

Wednesday February the 18th

Commences with a strong breeze from the W.S.W. and cloudy, the ship with all sail set steering S.W. by S. from 2 to 4 P.M. squally with rain took in topgallant Studding sails, Main Royal and Lower Studding sail at 7 took top Mast Studding sail, Midnight more moderate and set the Studding sails and main Royal, at 9 A.M. the wind hauled to the S.W. in lower Studding sail and set the jib, the latter part a fresh breeze and Drizzly weather Lat by Obs 51.39 South, Long by Chron 53.20 West 29 Months out

Remarks

Thursday February the 19th

Commences with a fresh breeze from N.W. and thick Drizzly weather, at 3 P.M. the breeze hauled to the S.W. braced sharp and in Studding sail, heading S.W. at 4 P.M. furled the main Royal & flying jib from 6 to 10 P.M. strong gales from North with rain, furled the top gallant sails & Double reefed the top sails, at 12 M. the wind hauled back to the N.W. and kept the ship S.W. by S. from 4 to 6 A.M. moderating and set all sail again, the latter part moderate breezes and fair weather Lat by Obs 50.20 South, Long by Chron 50.22 West

Friday February the 20th

Commences with a moderate breeze from N.W. & fair weather, the ship with all sail set steering S.W. by S. the middle part calm with with a large swell from the West, took in the light sails to save them at 9 A.M. a light breeze from the Westward and set all sail again at 10 A.M. sent up the fore Royal yard and set the sail the breeze hauling Northward Lat by Obs 48.48 South, Long by Chron 49.34

Saturday February the 21st

Commences with a light air from the N.W. with pleasant weather, the ship with all Drawing sail set steering S.W. by S. the Watch employed repairing sails at 4 P.M. unlashed the main sail & sent another, we have worn the old one 29 months, at 6 P.M. the breeze hauling to the North in Studding sails and braced sharp heading Eastward, at 7 P.M. wore ship to the N.W. through the night a light breeze from S.W. by S. ship heading S.W. by S. from 4 to 6 A.M. the wind hauled S.E. kept S.W. by S. and set the Starboard Studding sails the latter part a brisk breeze from S.E. Lat by Obs 48.34 South, Long by Chron 48.26 West

Sunday February the 22nd

Commences with a brisk breeze from S.E. and fair weather, the ship with all sail set steering S.W. by S. through the night a fresh breeze from S.W. and fair weather at 4 A.M. took a squall from West, from 4 to 10 A.M. furled the Royals and main topgallant sail and took in the Studding sails, Ends with a strong gale from W.S.W. and squally Lat by Obs 46.46 South, Long by Chron 46.00 West
