

Remarks Made on the Passage Home

Friday March the 5<sup>th</sup>

Commences with a light breeze from S & W and fair weather, the ship with top mast & topgallant standing sails both sides steering N N E, at 7 P.M. the breeze hauled to the S E, took in the larboard standing sails the middle and latter part a light breeze and fair weather the watch variously employed, Nothing of the Whale kind.

Lat by Obs 32.00 South, Long by Chron 32.09 West

Saturday March the 6<sup>th</sup>

Commences with a light breeze from S E, and fair weather the ship with all drawing sail set steering N N E, midnight the wind hauled to the E S E, with a brisk breeze and drizzly weather, at 3 A.M. furled the fore royal, at 7 A.M. squally & took in spanker, flying jib and all the standing sails the latter part a strong breeze and thick weather

Lat by Obs 29.30 South, Long by Act 30.50 West

Sunday March the 7<sup>th</sup>

Commences with a strong breeze from E S E and thick drizzly weather, ship with main royal set steering N N E, from 4 to 6 P.M. heavy showers with thunder at 5 furled the main royal, midnight squalls moderate and set all sail, at 1 A.M. the wind hauled to the E N E & braced sharp heading North, at 10 A.M. the breeze hauled back to the Eastward kept the ship N N E, and set topmast & topgallant standing sail

Lat by Obs 27.03 South, Long by Chron 31.49 West

Monday March the 8<sup>th</sup>

Commences with a light breeze from the Eastward and pleasant weather, the ship with all drawing sail set steering N N E, the middle & latter part occasional rain squalls the watch employed with jobs about the rigging & making Spungarn

Lat by Obs 24.58 South, Long by Chron 31.24 West

Tuesday March the 9<sup>th</sup>

Commences with a pleasant breeze from the Eastward and fair weather, the ship with all drawing sail set steering N N E, the middle & latter part a light breeze & baffling ship heading North & N N E, Employed rebanding the Bone

Lat by Obs 23.06 South, Long by Act 31.20 West

Wednesday March the 10<sup>th</sup>

All this 24 hours light breeze from the Eastward and fine weather, the ship with all sail set heading from North to N N E, all hands employed rebanding the Bone, Lat by Obs 21.24 South Long by Chron 31.24

Thursday March the 11<sup>th</sup>

The first part of this twenty four hours a light breeze from the Eastward and fine weather, the ship by the wind with all sail set heading N by E, the middle & latter part a brisk breeze and fine weather, the watch employed taring the rigging, at 12 M. exchanged signals with a Jamaica ship steering S S W

Lat by Obs 19.38 South, Long by Chron 32.02 West

Friday March the 12<sup>th</sup>

The first part a brisk breeze from the Eastward, ship by the wind with all sail set heading to the Northward, the middle & latter part occasional squalls with rain,

Lat by Obs 17.41 South, Long by Chron 32.34 West

Saturday March the 13<sup>th</sup>

All this 24 hours strong trades from the East, and rugged the ship with all sail set heading N N E Employed taring the rigging, Nothing of the Whale kind

Lat by Obs 15.23 South, Long by Chron 32.52 West

Sunday March the 14<sup>th</sup>

A continuation of strong trades from the East and fair weather, the ship by the wind with all sail set heading N N E,

Lat by Obs 12.41 South, Long by Chron 33.00 West

Monday March the 15<sup>th</sup>

The first and middle part of these 24 hours a brisk breeze from the East and pleasant weather the ship with all sail set steering N by E, the latter part a light breeze and fine weather, Nothing of the Whale kind

Lat by Obs 10.11 South, Long by Chron 32.40 West

Tuesday March the 16<sup>th</sup>

Commences with a light breeze from the East and fine weather, at 2 P.M. kept off North and set the standing sails, the middle part brisk breeze at 5 A.M. kept off N N E the latter part a pleasant breeze and extremely warm
