Remarks On Board Tuesday July 17th 1838

First Part of these 24 hours Commences with light winds from the West to East Steering the Ship South. Middle & Latter Parts Gentle Breezes from the N. East Steering the Ship South to En's these 24 hours all hands employed in Ship's Duty.

Remarks On Board Wednesday July 18

First Part of these 24 hours Commences with Gentle Breezes from the N. East, and Pleasant weather. Steering the Ship South at 4 P.M. saw a Sail off the Larboard beam, Middle Part Gentle Breezes from the N. East, at 6 A.M. saw a Ship off the Starboard beam Steering S. by W. Latter Part Light Winds Steering the Ship S. by West to En's these 24 hours all hands employed in Ship's Duty.

First Part of these 24 hours Commences with Light Winds from the N. East and Pleasant weather Steering the Ship South by West, Middle & Latter Parts Light Winds Steering the Ship South by West to En's these 24 hours all hands employed in Ship's Duty.

Remarks On Board Friday July 20th 1838

First Part of these 24 hours Commences with Light Winds from the South and Pleasant Weather Steering the Ship South by West at 4 P.M. saw two Sails one off the Larboard beam the other of Larboard quarter Middle Part Light Winds & Pleasant Weather, Latter Part the same Steering the Ship South to En's these 24 hours with the two Ships in Sight, all hands employed in Ship's Duty.

Long in by Obs. 22. 20 West

Remarks On Board Saturday July 21. 1838

First Part of these 24 hours Commences with Light Breezes from the North Steering the Ship South by West with the two Ships in Sight, Middle Part Light winds from the N. East Steering the Ship S. by W. at 8 A.M. saw a School of Sperm Whales leaved the Boat for them Larboard Boat fastened to one and hauled it brought it a long Side of the Ship, the Whales being the other Boats could not get fast, the Barke Ship Maria of New Bedford was in Sight and got one Whale out of the school Latter Part fresh Breezes from the N. East at 12 A.M. took the Whale a long Side of the Ship to En's these 24 hours all hands employed.
