First Part of these 24 hours Commences with Light Wind from S.W. Ship heading on a mind to the S.E. at 4 P.M. Wind hauled to the South Tacked Ship heading on a mind to the W.S.W. While Part Fresh Breezes and Squally weather at 10 P.M. Took in the Fore & Mizzen Toppallant Sails at 5 A.M. Tacked Ship to the S.E. at 3 P.M. Saw a Ship off the Lee Beam standing to East at 1 P.M. Tacked Ship to the W.S.W. Ship under all Sail. Latter Part Gentle Breeze and Squally So Ends these 24 hours all hands Employed in Ships Duty.

Remarks On Board Saturday August 4th 1838

First Part of these 24 hours Commences with Gentle Breeze from the S.W. and Squally weather Steering the Ship West on a mind. at 2 P.M. Tacked Ship to the S.E. While Latter Part Light winds & Pleasant weather Wind variable from S to S.W. Ship heading on a mind to the Southward & Eastward under all Sail So Ends these 24 hours all hands Employed in Ships Duty.

Remarks On Board Sunday August 5th 1838

First Part of these 24 hours Commences with Light Wind and Variable from South to S.W. at 1 P.M. Tacked Ship to the Westward at 4 P.M. Tacked Ship to the S.E. Two Ships in Sight to the Leeward standing to the S.E. on a mind While Latter Part Gentle Breeze from S.W. Ship heading to S.E. on a mind under all Sail, one Sail in Sight off Starboard quarter heading to the S.E. So Ends these 24 hours all hands Employed in Ships Duty.

Part Fresh Breeze from S.W. by S and Squally Latter Part Gentle Breeze and Sails of rain at 9 A.M. Tacked Ship to the Westward Ship on a mind, Saw a Ship off the weather Don So Ends these 24 hours all hands Employed in Ships Duty.

Wind from the South Latter Part Fresh Breeze from the South and Pleasant Weather, Several Sail of vessels in Sight So Ends these 24 hours all hands Employed in Ships Duty.
