Set the Fore & Main top Gallant Sails Latter Part Gentle Breezes from S. by E. Ship heading S. W. on a Wind to Breeze these 24 hours all hands Employed in Ships Duty

Took in the Fore & Main Top Gallant Sails Middle Part Fresh Breezes with squalls of Wind & Rain Late Part the same at 10 P.M. Took in the Main Top Gallant Sails at 11 P.M. took a reef in Main Top Sails Wind from the S. by E. Ship heading S. W. on a Wind. Ship heading from five hundred to eight hundred strokes in 24 hours Round the Leach in the Ship then took out the Transom Leach to stop it could not get at it to docked it to be a long side of the Stern Part, to Breeze these 24 hours all hands Employed, with no Ob
