First Part of these 24 hours Commences with Light Winds from the S by E Ship heading S.W. by E. on a Wind While Part Light Winds from the S.E. latter Part Winds from the E.S.E. Ship heading South on a Wind, employed in Dismantling the 4 Fore Sail per a Cruising Sail To End these 24 hours

Remarks On Board Wednesday August 22^d 1838

First Part of these 24 hours Commences with Light Winds from the S.E. Ship heading S.W. on a Wind under all Sail While Part Light Winds inter mixed with Calms latter Part Light Breeze from the S.E. Ship heading S.W. on a Wind under all Sail To End these 24 hours all hands employed in Ship's Duty.

Remarks On Board Thursday August 23^d 1838

First Part of these 24 hours Commences with Gentle Breeze from the S.E. and Pleasant Weather Ship heading S.W. on a Wind While & latter Part Light Winds from the East Ship heading S.E. on a Wind To End these 24 hours all hands employed in Ship's Duty

Remarks On Board Friday August 24th 1838

First Part of these 24 hours Commences with Light Winds from the E.N.E. Steering the Ship S.E. at 1 P.M. Set the Topmast Standing Sail While Part Light Winds from the North at 10 A.M. Set the fore Standing Sail at 6 A.M. Set two Sail off the Starboard quarter latter Part Light Winds from the N.W. Steering the Ship S.E. under all Sail To End these 24 hours all hands employed in Ship's Duty

Remarks On Board Saturday August 25th 1838

First Part of these 24 hours Commences with Gentle Breeze from the N.W. Steering the Ship S.E. under all Sail While & latter Part Moderate Breeze from the N.W. Steering the Ship S.E. under all Sail two Ship in Sight one of them hoisted English Colours I supposed he to be a Brigate Steering S.E. To End these 24 hours all hands employed in Ship's Duty

Remarks On Board Sunday August 26th 1838

First Part of these 24 hours Commences with Moderate Breeze from the N.W. with Pleasant weather Steering the Ship S.E. under all Sail While Part the same latter Part Fresh Breeze from the West Steering the Ship S.E. by E under all Sail three Sail vessels in Sight Steering to the East To End these 24 hours all hands employed in Ship's Duty
