Remarks On Board Monday September 3<sup>d</sup> 1838

First Part of these 24 hours Commences with a Gale of Wind from the South Ship heading S.E. under short Sail Middle Part more moderate but the fore sail at 7 AM Lat Double reef topsails Latter Part strong Breezes and equally Wind from the South Ship heading on a Wind to the S by South So Ends these 24 hours all hands Employed in Ships Duty

First Part of these 24 hours Commences with Fresh Breezes from the South Ship heading S by E on a Wind at 3 P.M. Lat the Fore & Main Sail Middle Part Light Winds & Calms Made all Sail on the Ship Latter Part Light Breezes from the South Ship heading S.E. on a Wind So Ends these 24 hours Employed in sending down the Fore & Mizzen Top Gallant yards and Top Gallants

First Part of these 24 hours Commences with Light Winds from the South Ship heading S.E. on a Wind under all Sail Middle Part Light Winds inter mixed with Calms Latter Part Moderate Breezes from the N.W. Steering the Ship S.E. by S under all Sail So Ends these 24 hours all hands Employed in Ships Duty

Remarks On Board Tuesday September 6<sup>th</sup> 1838

First Part of these 24 hours Commences with Gentle Breezes from the N.W. Steering the Ship S.E. by South under all Sail Middle & Latter Part Gentle Gales from the N.W. Steering the S.E. by South under all Sail So Ends these 24 hours all hands Employed in Ships Duty

Remarks On Board Friday September 7<sup>th</sup> 1838

First Part of these 24 hours Commences with Fresh Gales from the N.W. Steering the Ship S.E. by South at 6 P.M. Took in the Main Top Gallant Sail & Double reef the Fore & Mizzen Top Sails Middle Part more moderate with Showers of Rain Wind from the West Steering the Ship S.E. by South at 4 P.M. Lat reef out of the Top Sails and set the Main Top Gallant Sail Latter Part Pleasant Weather Wind from the S.W. Steering the Ship S.E. by S under all Sail So Ends these 24 hours all hands Employed
