

Ship Board of 'Vine' Bordered in the South.

Remarks On Board Friday October 26th 1838

First Part of these 24 hours Commenced with light winds from the North Ship on different Tacks Cruising at 5 AM spoke the Ship 'Richard' of Salem Williams master with no sail, at 4 PM took in sail and let the Ship lead to the NW Wind Part Fresh Breeze from the North at 5 AM let Double reef Top Sail on the Ship at 8 AM came on thick and rainy with heavy squalls took in sail and let the Ship by to under a Bleat reef Main Top Sail and Fore Sail latter Part Fresh Gale with thick rainy weather Ship leaving W by N to End there 24 hours.

Remarks On Board Saturday October 27th 1838

First Part of these 24 hours Commenced with fresh Gale from the NW Ship heading to the West at 2 PM reared Ship to the NW Ship lying to under a Bleat reef Main Top Sail Middle Part further Gale at 4 PM set Double reef Top Sail latter Part Breeze moderate Wind from the South more all sail on the Ship, leading West, and several fine Backs to End there 24 hours all hands employed.

Remarks on Board Sunday October 28th 1838

First Part of these 24 hours Commenced with light Winds & variable from South to NW Ship heading on different Tacks Cruising with a heavy sea on at 4 PM took in sail and let the Ship by to under short sail Middle Part Fresh Breeze from the North with thick rainy weather middle Part the same Ship lying to under short sail leading West to End there 24 hours.

Remarks On Board Monday October 28th 1838

First Part of these 24 hours Commenced with Fresh Gale from the NW Ship heading to the NW under short sail Middle Part Light Winds and rainy weather at 6 PM made all sail on the Ship latter Part Gentle Breeze from the West with Pleasant weather Ship heading on different Tacks Cruising for Chase to End there 24 hours all hands employed.

Remarks On Board Tuesday October 30th 1838

First Part of these 24 hours Commenced with Light Winds from the West Ship heading to the Eastward at 1 PM under the Fore Top Sail and Commenced repairing it at 5 PM finished the Top Sail and sent it aloft, then a Right Whale rose the Boat without success Boat came on board at 6 PM took in sail and let the Ship by to under 1 Port Sail heading to the North Middle Part Fresh Breeze from the NW at 6 AM let Double reef Top Sail on the Ship at 10 AM saw two Right Whales rose the Boat hauled boat fastened to one of them and the crew drove but four rows by the Whale latter Part Fresh Gale from the North at 12 Took in the Fore and Mizzen Top Sails Ship heading on different Tacks Cruising to End there 24 hours all hands employed.

Remarks On Board Wednesday October 31st 1838

First Part of these 24 hours Commenced with Fresh Gale from the NW Ship lying to under short sail heading on different Tacks Middle Part Gentle Gale from the West to NW Ship heading to the NW under short sail to End there 24 hours all hands employed.
