Remarks On Board Tuesday November 13<sup>th</sup> 1838

First Part of these 24 hours commences with light winds and variable from South to S.W. Ship heading on different tacks Cruising can several fine Barks at 4 P.M. took in the Main Sail & Main Top Gallant Sail let the Ship lay to the S.E. under the Top Sails and Stic Middle Part Light Winds intermixed with Calms at 5 P.M. made all sail on the Ship at 10 P.M. saw two Right Whales to the windward going quick did not lose latter part light winds from the S.W. Ship heading on different tacks Cruising to ends these 24 hours all hands employed

Remarks On Board Wednesday November 14<sup>th</sup> 1838

First Part of these 24 hours commences with gentle breezes from the N.E. Ship on different tacks Cruising at 5 P.M. saw a school of sperm Whales loved the boat for them Larkboard Boat fastened to one of them held the Whales and took it along side of the Ship at 7 P.M. Water Boat fastened to one and drained tub in sail and let the Whales lay along side of the Ship Middle Part gentle breeze at 8 P.M. commenced cutting in the Whales at 11 P.M. finished cutting latter part fresh gales from the N.W. with rain Ship heading to the S.E. under a sheet reefed Main Top Sail to ends these 24 hours all hands employed

Remarks On Board Thursday November 15<sup>th</sup> 1838

First Part of these 24 hours commences with fresh Gale from the N.W. Ship heading to S.E. under a sheet reefed Main Top Sail, heavy showers of rain and S.C. Middle Part fresh from the N.W. Ship heading to the S.E. latter part heavy gales from the W.N.W. Ship heading to the South under a sheet reefed Main Top Sail to ends these 24 hours all hands employed

Atlantic Ocean Cruising for Right Whales,  
Remarks On Board Friday November 16<sup>th</sup> 1838

First Part of these 24 hours commences with fresh Gale from the West Ship heading to the N.W. under a sheet reefed Main Top Sail Middle Part more moderate at 6 P.M. Made Sail on the Ship and commenced hauling on our Blubber at 9 P.M. saw a right Whale loved the Boat with out success latter part fresh breezes and rough weather Winds from the N.W. Ship on different tacks Cruising one Ship in sight to ends these 24 hours all hands employed in hauling &c.

Remarks On Board Saturday November 17<sup>th</sup> 1838

First Part of these 24 hours commences with fresh breezes from the West with a heavy sea running Ship heading on different tacks Cruising Employed in hauling out our blubber took three Whales loved the Boat with out success Whales appeared the Ship and took to the Windward at 7 P.M. took in sail and let the Ship lay to under short sail Middle Part fresh breezes from the West with squalls of rain at 5 P.M. finished hauling out our blubber & made all sail on the Ship saw several Right Whales loved for them with out success Whales are very wild a very heavy sea on going Ship in sight latter part fresh breezes from the W.W. Ship heading on different tacks Cruising to ends these 24 hours all hands employed

Remarks On Board Sunday November 18<sup>th</sup> 1838

First Part of these 24 hours commences with gentle breezes from the West Ship heading on different tacks Cruising saw several Right Whales loved the Boat with out success Whales are very wild about 10 at 4 P.M. took in sail and let the Ship lay to under short sail Middle Part light winds and the out weather at 5 P.M. made all sail on the Ship latter part light winds from N.W. Ship heading on different tacks Cruising saw several fine Barks and one Ship in sight Paled upon the Main of Fair haven to ends these 24 hours all hands employed
