Remarks On Board Saturday January 12th 1839

First Part of these 24 hours Commenced with light winds from the East Ship heading on different tracks Cruising at 7 PM took in sail and let the ship by two under short sail made out gentle breeze from the North at 4 AM made all sail on the ship latter part gentle breeze from the North & Pleasant weather Ship heading to the South saw several fine Barks So ends these 24 hours all hands employed

Long in by Calc 8° 12' W

Remarks On Board Sunday January 13th 1839

First Part of these 24 hours Commenced with fresh breeze from the North Steering the Ship South at 6 PM took in sail and let the ship two under a light west main Top sail made out gentle breeze and foggy at 5 AM made all sail on the ship latter part fresh breeze and misty weather winds from the N.W. Ship heading to the S.E. So ends these 24 hours,

Remarks On Board Monday January 14th 1839

First Part of these 24 hours Commenced with fresh breeze from the N.W. with thick foggy weather Steering the Ship S.E. at 7 PM took the fore & main Top sails and let the ship head to the S.E. made out fresh gale from the West at 5 AM set the fore & main Top sails and main top Gallant sail latter part fresh gale, Steering the Ship East So ends these 24 hours,

Lat in by Obs 42° 50' N
Long in by Calc 8° 02' W

Remarks On Board Tuesday January 15th 1838

First Part of these 24 hours Commenced with fresh gale from the West Steering the Ship East at 1 PM sent down the main top Gallant sail and repaired it, at 8 PM ran several spouts off the foreward beam at 4 took in sail and let the ship by two under a light west main top sail heading to the North made out more moderate at 4 AM made all sail on the ship, steered to the East latter part gentle breeze from the West with foggy weather Steering the Ship East under all sail So ends these 24 hours,

Remarks On Board Wednesday January 16th 1838

First Part of these 24 hours Commenced with gentle breeze from the West with pleasant weather Steering to the S.E. under all sail made out light winds and variable from W to N.W. latter part gentle breeze from the N.W. with thick foggy weather & shower of rain Steering the Ship to the S.E. under all sail So ends these 24 hours,

Remarks On Board Thursday January 17th 1838

First Part of these 24 hours Commenced with gentle breeze from the North with thick foggy weather Steering the Ship S.E. under all sail, made out fresh breeze from the N.W. with thick foggy weather with shower of rain latter part gentle breeze and foggy weather from the N.W. Steering the Ship S.E. under all sail So ends these 24 hours,
