

Off Marygoldang Merchantman From Manila Andruca Passage

Tuesday August 30th 1864

Strong wind from S.E.

At 4 P.M. the island of Marygoldang at a distance of 10 miles

Off. Day during the day employed at ship duty.

Wednesday 31st

This day strong wind from S.E. with thick and cloudy weather. saw a number of Sulphur Bottom. Had a heavy rain squall. Clear & pleasant at sun.

Thursday September 1st 1864

This day comes

for clear with light S.E. winds. employed at Coopering and other duties of the ship.

Friday 2nd

Commenced with light and variable winds. With thick and rainy weather. stowed down some oil in main hold.

Saturday 3rd

Moderate wind from S.E. at 3 o'clock. Lowered and sent a boat along side the English ship Labridore from Manila. Bound to London.

Sunday September 4th 1864

~~Clear with light wind from S.E. at 11 A.M. raised a school of Whales. Lowered Larboard Waist & B. Boats. Succeeded in striking and at 3 P.M. had three secured along side the ship.~~

Monday 5th

Commenced fine with strong wind from S.E. Employed at clearing away heads & boiling.

Tuesday 6th

Strong wind from S.E. employed at boiling and other duties pertaining to whaling. At 4 P.M. finished boiling. Turned up to 40° B.

Wednesday 7th

Light wind from S.E. even employed at ship duty. During the day, at sundown clear with moderate wind from South.

Thursday 8th

This day commenced fine with light wind from S.E. Employed at coopering during the day.
