Thursday October 6th 1864

Pleasant with a light breeze from S.E. at day broke hose shot - Our chain, at 7 AM made sail and left off down of Kema with three bushels of ^{which we paid 4 rubes a Pickle for (33 lbs)} And four Pickles of Sweet Potatoes 5 rubes a Pickle this being all they had it not being the right season for them, repairing ^{boat} Carboard.

Friday 7th

Commenced with a fine breeze from S.W. Making our way to Latta Island.

Sat 8th

Light-southerly wind, at 4 OC finished the Carboard boat and set her on her cranes At 4.30 P.M. steered S.E. by E.

Sund 9th

Commenced with fine weather at day Light-saw a ship of the beam which proved to be the Lazelle of Bedford Capt. Worth. Capt. and Wife came on board and when the day the color one that she is accu- with Albert my brother after she was at Haumille waiting for her husband and he in the Vanderbilt.

Monday October 10th 1864

Commenced with a Calm, Lazelle about 4 miles off, Capt & Wife lowered a boat and pulled to her Capt. Returned at 11 AM leaving his Wife

Tuesday 11th

This day a nice breeze from S.W. three sails for light at 4 PM Capt. Safford of Seadown came on board staying 1/2 hour Capt. Bee went on board Lazelle of his wife Net at 11 OC PM without her. Squared the Vards and steered N.N.E.

Wed 12th

Fine with a light-southerly wind, at 6 OC Luffed to wind Lazelle about 2 miles off. Capt. went on board, at 10 PM returned with

Thurs 13th

Calm during the day employed at ship

Friday 14th

Commenced with a light-breeze from S.W. With thick & rainy weather, steering S.W. At 3 OC luffed to wind,
