

Bound to Kema
after sundown

Saturday Oct 15th 1864.

This day light from
the N. with heavy rain, squalls. Ship steering
N.W. by N. Bark headmost in sight.

Sun 16th

Commenced with a calm, at 3 Pm had
a light breeze from the seaward, and
luffed to the wind.

Mon 17th

Light southerly wind, at 12 Oc kept her N.W.
At sundown the island of Belle in sight
bearing N.W.

Tues 18th

Light breeze from the south, course N.W.
For Kema, at 11 20 mi had a summer of
rain squalls.

Wed 19th

Calm, at 11 Oc had a light breeze from
S. steering E. N.E., at 4 O'clock Pm got up
and put the barbed chain.

Thursday October 20th 1864.

Commenced with a
light breeze from off shore, the town of
Kema about 2 miles off. at 7 30 lowered a
Boat and went on shore and got our
Men who had been in prison, two weeks.
Ship anchored and on board and
at 11 Am took our anchor and went ^{out}



Frid 21st

This day light wind and pleasant weather
At 7 Am sent a new main sail, empty
At ship duty.

Sat 22nd

Commenced with light wind from S.W.
With pleasant weather, nothing of note.

Sund 23rd

Commenced with a light breeze from S.W.
With pleasant weather, all was quiet the day.

Mon 24th

Commenced with a light westerly wind with
thick rainy weather.
