

Andrucca Passage

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Monday November 14th 1864
Commenced with pleasant weather and light wind, the island of Latta 15 miles off, the sea green in sight - employed in setting up main rigging. At 11 A.M. had a heavy rain squall.

Tues 15th

This day light wind from the south steering N. by W. employed in setting up main rigging.

Wed 16th

This day light wind from S steering N. by E. Mr. Luffor & minor, employed in setting up main rigging.

Thurs 17th

This day a sick calm, employed at ship duty, saw a number of crampfish.

Fry 18th

Commenced with a light air from S. At 7 A.M. a sick calm and heavy fog. Capt. took Wais Boat and went to fishing in a bush that is somewhat seen in great numbers with a few more.

Off Latta

Saturday November 19th

This day a calm and hot as any one can wish of, see it - employed at ship duty.

Sun 20th

Pleasant with a light air from S.W. Nothing occurred of note during the day.

Mon 21st

This day light air & calm, employed at ship duty during the day, at sundown took in light sails.

Tues 22nd

Light air and calm, Latta in sight. Saw a large breach, employed as usual.

Wed 23rd

This day light air and calm, employed at ship duty. Davis, Takler & Co.

Thurs 24th

This day light air & calm, sent down for top sails & sail for repairs, at 4.20 P.M. sent it up again and sent it.
