Monday December the 20th 1824

This day commences
With light air and calm at sundown a light
Breeze from N.E. kept the ship off to go
through the Straits which bear N.W. After
supper had some disturbance with a

Wed 21st

This day comes in with moderate wind from
the North ship steering for the Straits, at 4.15
In the passage which we sounded and at
21 fathoms no more heads after 2 o'clock P.M.
No current running at all.

Thurs 22nd

This day comes in nice and pleasant with
Light wind from N.E. last night at 11.15
Passed through the Guy Round Strait
Ship steering N.W. with a strong current
Setting to the North. after noon had
A rain squall but no wind with it.

Round to Boston

Off Boston

Friday December the 23rd 1824

This day commences
With thick rain weather, at 12 o'clock A.M. pleasant
With the wind from the N. steering N.W.
At 2 P.M. the Island of Waxue being N.W.
Kept the ship of land steering N.W. at
4 o'clock saw the Island Bengala bearing
S.W. distance 20 miles.

Sat 24th

These twenty four hours begins with pleasant
Weather moderate wind from N. ship steering
South passed a number of islands lying
to the South of Waxue, all was quiet during
the day excepting the noise which arose from
the Benches where they are making the
Carpenters Chests over smaller.

Sun 25th

Commences with light air from the N.
Ship steering N. at 1 o'clock P.M. saw
A merchant bark steering for Pitts
Passage.
