

Off Ambellan) Westward monsoon in Repaired Fore Sails

Sunday January the 1st 1865

Commenced with
thick rain, weather with heavy squalls. Wind
W. N. W. ship cruising by the line, at sundown
the island of Ambellan bearing N. E. by E. 30 miles

Mon 2nd

This day commenced with light wind from N. W.
Ship by the wind standing in shore, at 8 o'clock
Ambellan bearing N. E. by E. 25 miles. Tacked
and stood off shore. At 1 o'clock P. M. tacked on
again thick and rainy during the afternoon
from, at sundown Ambellan bearing N. E.
Distance 30 miles Current setting East

Tues 3rd

This day comes in with pleasant weather with
moderate wind from W. N. W. ship by the
wind, at 2 o'clock kept up and from 10
miles, sent down Fore Top Sail for repairs

Wed 4th

Ambellan

This day commenced with a heavy squall
which lasted until 1 o'clock P. M.,
Current setting to the West. at 5 o'clock
P. M. saw a large break

Thursday January the 5th 1865

This day begins
with pleasant weather and a nice shoal
wind which lasted until 12 o'clock P. M.
then came on a squall which lasted about
1/2 hour ship sent down Fore Mast
for repairs. Sent in a rain at 1 o'clock
at sundown wind from W. N. W. bearing
N. E.

Fri 6th

This day comes in rain with a strong double
Keep Top Sail loose from the W. N. W. at day
light the Lucepera islands bearing N. E. by E.
at sundown a large reef in sight bearing
W. N. W. this day struck a small ship in
the hand. while making a climb

Sat 7th

This day comes in with a moderate gale from
the W. at day light Lucepera bearing N. E.
At 4 P. M. wind from W. N. W. moderate
Down to a strong breeze at sundown
Van Tuatle island bearing N. E. distance 12 miles
