San Yhe Mary

Wednesday, Feb the 15th 1865

This day, moderate breeze.
From N. W. at daylight the island of Boram
Bearing S. N. East 9 o'clock ran a sail. The
Leander called it the Mary, at sundown
the island of Boram bearing N. West 25 miles

Thurs 16

May,

This day commenced with strong breeze from the N. at 11 o'clock saw the under whaling of 10-
Leopard, at 11 $\frac{1}{2}$ saw her take the whale.
The ship, at sundown the island leaving
W. by N distance 35 miles

Fri 17 May

This is a strong breeze from N.W. at 10 a.m.
Light rain a large beach, run for it - But
Can it no more, many of our sea birds
are sunboun Sarah being sick - 10 miles

Feb 18th

This day being with strong wind from the N. E. ship took a round turn keeping of two points every 10 minutes. Left Miami at six. At 6 O'clock P.M. raised Wholly but did not lower, at sundown the island bearing N. E. N Dist 40 mi.

R. Sunday February the 19th 1865

Comences with a
Strong breeze from the N.W. ship under double reef.
The mast in sight, saw nothing except a Grampus.
At sundown Garam bearing N.W. dist 40 miles.

Mon 20th

Commenced with half a gale of wind from N.W.
Bark under double reefed topsails all day.
The Mary ast in sight; at 5 o'clock P.M.
A large breach reported from aloft; at
last down foremast bearing West about 35 miles
at 5

June 24

This day commenced with strong N.W. wind.
Bark Mary in sight. saw a number of Grampians
Tiring the day and a great many bushes and
Leaves at Subtown Loham bearing N. dist 30 miles.
Thus ends my Birth Day.

This day commences with strong wind from N.W. at 1 o'clock P.M. gamed with Mary. At sundown Goram bearing W. at 10¹/₂ o'clock
