Sea Queen

Tuesday March The 14th

This day, light variable
Wind, and frequent showers of rain, Sea Queen
in sight, at 4 o'clock sent T. T. & Lail down
for repairs, also sent down a man. T. T. &
Lail and sent up an old one, at sundown
Batchian bearing E. dist 25 miles,

Wed 15th

Commenced with light variable air and
Rain during the forenoon, Sea Queen
in sight, current setting strong to the ^W
at sundown Batchian bearing E. dist 20

Thurs 16th

Commenced with strong wind from W, under
Top Sail, no fire or smoke, Sea Queen
in sight, at sundown Batchian bearing
E. dist 25 miles

Fri 17

Moderate and clear, sent down for
Sail and repairs, Sea Queen in sight
at sundown Batchian bearing E. dist
25 miles

Molucca Passage

Off Marley

Saturday March The 18th 1865

Commenced

With strong winds from N.W. and clear weather
Ship under Top Sail, employed at repairing,
A spare Top Sail, saw nothing of the Sea Queen
Current setting strong to the West at sundown
Batchian bearing E. dist 30 miles,

Sunday 19th

This day commenced with light winds from
N.W. clear weather, saw nothing of the Sea Queen
Last night the current changed and set to the
South, at sundown Batchian bearing N.E.
Distance 18 miles, saw no ships.

Monday 20th

This day comes in with light wind from
N.W. and clear weather, saw the Sea
Queen to windward at sundown Marley
bearing N.E. dist 20 miles
