Monday April the 17th 1865

This day

Came in with light air and squalls.
At daylight cut in the whale we took last
Evening, at 9 o'clock started the marks on
Horn, employed at clearing away the head &c &c

Tues 18th

This day light air from E, at 10 o'clock
Drove the marks and sent the watch below
Watch employed at cooping oil 40 miles north

Wed 19th

This day light wind from E, at day light
Commenced to let down in after hatch at 7 am
Down had 85 lbs down Lat 00 25 N Long 133 31 E

Thurs 20th

Lat 00 22 N Long 133 10

This day light air from E, men employed
At putting up cutting gear &c &c

Frid 21st

The fore part of this day light variable winds.
At 12 o'clock had a blue breeze from N which

Later, at day, employed at setting up sheets and
making Dungs. Lat 00 22 N Long 133 34 E

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Saturday April the 22nd 1865

This day comes in

With a nice breeze from E ship entering by
The wind on the Port tack, men employed
At stowing oil and empty cask in bin
Hatch for water; at 4 o'clock saw land
Bearing N. what the name of it is is more
Than I can say as the capt thinks it is
To tell anyone where he is but I have just
found out by the old Roman that we live on
Guinea and in the Lat 00 58 N Long 133 04

Sun 23rd

This day light variable winds, saw nothing of note
Excepting a great quantity of drift wood, some
Large bits. The current setting South strong.

Mon 24th

Lat 01 02 N Long 133 52

This day comes in with light variable winds
and frequent showers of rain, I was
Employed all day making a mast for
Starboard boat in a hot sun where it was
Not fit for any man to work.

Lat 01 58 N Long 134 38 E
