This day comes in with
Squally weather. at 12 o'clock cleared up and
Had the wind from the S.E. at 1 o'clock
Heman Wicks raised a school of whales going N
Lowered for them but Waist-boat went in and
Missed. They went then until they came
Up with a school of 3 fish when they brought
to and Bow Boat went on and struck whales
23 brought good, brought four of them to the ship
W.B. Lat 01.27 N Long 134.44
No 14

Mon 29th

This day at daybreak hooked on to the
And at 1 o'clock had them in and started

Tue 30th

Employed at boiling and mousing had one
Squall through the day.

Wednesday

At-Davis in sight

Thursday May The 31st

At daylight-cooled down
and cleared up and collected the oil it
turned up 115 lbs. Squally through the fore noon
Thurs June The 1st

This day comes in with strong wind from N.W.
Ship steering to the Eastward, unemploying
At cooping oil, at daylight At-Davis
in sight bearing S.W. distance 15 miles
Fri 2nd

This day moderate wind from the E.S.E. with many
Passing showers of rain, between squall employed
At cooping oil:

Sat 3rd

This day comes in with moderate wind from E
With frequent showers of rain at 7 o'clock A.M.
Saw thick raised a school of whales going to
Windward. Lowered our boats and off the board
Boat succeeded in getting one, Lat 01.06 North
Long 134.35 East
