

Borneo to Malacca Passage

In Dampier's Straits -
To Malacca Passage

Tuesday June the 20th 1865

This day pleasant with
A moderate breeze from E. & S. which steering N. & N. E.
For Dampier's Straits. Back Napier in sight
the N. side of New Guinea near Cape Good
Hope.

Wed 21st

This day commences with light air from S. W.
Ship kept up between the N. & W. end of Borneo
and the island of Wagon. men employed at
trapping. Rocks and various other objects
on the ship, at sundown the island of
Wagon bearing N. dist 20 miles

Thurs 22nd

This day comes in with a strong breeze from
S. W. and squally weather, at 8 A.M. cleared up
and had light wind from S. W. the remaining
part of the day, at four o'clock bent the main
sail and got the Port Anchor of the boat

In Dampier's Straits -

Off Obi Major again

Friday June the 23rd 1865

This day comes in with
A strong breeze from S. W. which lasted until
8 o'clock A.M. then had a calm until
12 o'clock ship drifting down on to the Boon
Island all the while then a heavy breeze
sprang up from S. which took us through the
Straits at 3 o'clock took the anchor on the
Boon again ship running through the Sulu Pass
Sat 24th

This day commences with a strong breeze from
the S. & S. W. with clear weather at day light
Obi Major in sight bearing S. W. and sun
down in forenoon Batochian
Sun 25th

This day strong wind from S. at day
light a sail in sight at 10 o'clock P.M.
I named her (the Orinda) 26 months out 6 or 7
M. sun down Maragdang bearing E. dist 10
