Employed at supplying their wants, sold to

her 15 Bbls of flour 4 3/4 of Beef, 2 Cask of Bread

And 10 caskons of tar, some more & c.c.

Tues 27th

This day moderate, pleasant weather, at

day light Oceola in sight, at 10 o'clock 4 m.

She had her boats down, we stood along so

We could see the whale by that time. She struck

A Cow & calf but the cow stole the second one.

And he cut and let him go

Wed 28th

This day moderate wind and pleasant weather

At day light saw and passed the Sea Lion

At 12 o'clock tacked back and saw her again

Just at night, at 7 o'clock sent a boat on board

And got our letters which she took at Oceola.

Since we left here the Sea Lion took 60 lbs

1865

This day fine pleasant

Weather, at 8 o'clock H. Wells raised a

School of whales lowered our boats and

Starboard boat struck and got one

Boat had one missed, Cal-sun down

Capt. Sifford came on board,

Fri 30th

Pleasant weather at day light got the

Boiling men employed at stripping Port Salt

Saturday July The 1st 1865

Fine pleasant

Weather got a boat out for the Oceola

This she sold to her three Bbls of Flour

1 1/4 Bbls of beef One Chest of Tea and

Sold her old last voyage boat with

Port but it in to the Port and sold

Bowline it was run
