Thursday June 28th 1855

This day comes in with light winds & fine weather steering to the S.E. wind & at 7 shortened sail Am weather fine at daylight made sail at 9 am & Darius steering to the E. ward. People employed in various duties this continues this day.

Friday June 29th

These 24 hours comes in with light breezes from N.W. steering S.E. under easy sail. People employed in various duties at sunset shortened sail to a double reefed fore sail and luffed by wind to the N. ward Am fresh from west set double reefed fore sail & fore sail. Am ready in kind out for water & timber. As bends with pumping ship as usual to do every four hours.

Lat by Obs 31.34 N

Saturday June 30th

This day comes in with a fresh gale from the N.W. at once 9 am took in fore & fore B. sail. People employed in stowing off between decks at 3 squally & things took in the fore sail Am fair with strong breezes from the N.W. set foresail at 10. Set fore B. sail double reefed thus continues with pumping ship as usual at the end of every four hours.

Sunday July 1st 1855

This day comes in with fair weather and strong breezes from the N.W. at 4 took in the fore B. sail at 6 in fore sail & set fore & fore B. sail. The ship heading to the E. ward at 10 am were ship to the N. ward Am strong gale at 8 were ship again at 9 close reefed the fore B. sail thus continues with passing clouds.

Monday July 2nd

Comes in with a strong gale from N.W. Ship lying to under storm sails heading E. S.W. at 4 pm were ship to the N. ward at 8 am were around toward the weather squally and rainy about 10. Saw a sail heading E. ward thus continues this day.
