These 24 hours come in with fair weather and fresh breezes from the N. steering S by E. at sundown shortened sail and layed by the wind to the westward Am employed in setting up rigging wind N by E course S S E

Thursday July 5th

Came in with fine weather and light breezes from N.W. course S S E & employed in setting up rigging at 10 PM saw the Island of Cuba bearing S E by S. Also saw the Island of Glorioso at sundown shortened sail. At Am called all hands and made sail weather thick and rain about 8 AM spoke with the Schooner Silver Cloud 15 days from Boston bound to Florida and Cayal thus continues no obs

Remarks

Friday July 6th

This day comes in fair with light breezes from the North ship heading to the Southward about 8 labored our boats to pull for practice at sundown shortened sail and steered S by E and fine weather set all sail & steered S E by E people employed variously

Saw two ships steering E ward thus ends with pumping ship

This day comes in with pleasant weather and light breezes from NW steering S E. employed in setting up rigging at sunset shortened sail & layed by the wind to the N.W. ward Am fair made sail and steered S by E at 8 saw Gal at 12 near the west cape bore sight 15 miles thus continues this day
