 Remarks Tuesday July 10th 1855
 Comes in fair with light breezes
 from the N. Ship heading to the
 E. ward at sun down tack'd ship
 to the W. ward & shortened sail
 weather rainy saw 5 sail steering
 E. ward. Am fresh breezes made
 sail & stood in towards Bearia
 at 10 noon ship & stood off to the S.E.
 thus continues this day

Remarks Wednesday July 11
 This day comes in fair at one hour
 for blackfish & did not see them
 afterwards at sun set shortened sail
 at 8 noon ship to the W. ward Am
 made all sail and tack'd ship
 steered S.E. saw the Island of
 St. Michel bearing S.E. per
 compass. weather in light
 winds from N.E. employed in
 surveying the lagoon & the
 main rigging and setting it up
 thus continues this day

Remarks Thursday July 12th
 This day comes in fine with
 light winds from the N. Ship
 heading to the E. ward at sundown
 shortened sail and noon ship
 to the W. ward Am fair with fresh
 breezes from S.E. set whole B. sail
 and courses at 8 noon ship to the
 E. ward towards St. Michel at noon
 the side about 12 miles dist the
 cultivation looked beautiful. thus
 ends this day. people impatient about
 the rigging & gunnery ship as usual

Capt. Tucker & Cruising
 Remarks Friday July 13th 1855
 This day comes in with fair weather
 and fresh breezes from N.E.
 Ship heading to the E. ward
 at sun set shortened sail Am
 at daylight noon ship to the
 N. ward made sail at noon
 the East end of St. Michel
 bore west dist 15 miles thus
 ends

Remarks Saturday July 14th
 Comes in fine with fresh
 breezes from N.E. at 9 AM
 tack'd to the E. ward at sun
 set shortened sail and noon
 ship to the N. ward about noon again
 to the E. ward Am light air set
 all sail at 8 tack'd to the W. ward
 St. Michel bearing N.W. thus
 ends this day Dist by obs 35.45

Remarks Sunday July 15th
 This 24 hours comes in fair and
 gentle breezes from N.E. Ship
 standing to the W. ward with all
 sail set at 7 AM and from N.W. and
 light breeze the light sails the
 Island of St. Michel E. end bore
 S. by N. and St. Mary's S. by W. at
 midday took
 Am wind from the north set the
 light sail saw A. Begg heading to the
 W. ward thus continues this day
 set by obs 37.19
