Wednesday Aug 16th 1856

This day news fair weather and light breezes from the N.E. Ship with all sail out people variously employed this ends Graciosa about 10 m distant cooper tacked up with a bad finger

Thursday Aug 18th

Comes in fair with light breezes from N.E. Ship heading to the E. ward Am wind to the N.W. at 5. tacked to the W. ward saw a ship steering E. ward at 10 h. tacked to the N.E. at noon Becaria Wind bore S.S.W. 50 ends

Friday Aug 17th

Comes in fair with light breezes from the N. Ship heading E. ward with all sail out people employed in making out for water and coals &c. about 3.10 Pm Mr Joseph the S.D. officer was sent to his stateroom for using abusive language to the Chief Officer and Capt. Tucker telling him he did not care a dam for him nor no one else or anything therefore Capt. Tucker sent him to his room to do no more duty on board.

of this Ship at sundown shortened sail Am settle sail Ship heading to the E. ward at 11 h. squally in S.B. sails saw a sail at noon the west end of Becaria bore South Dist about 12 miles this ends

Saturday Aug 18th 1856

Pm fresh breezes from E.N.E. with passing clouds at 5 h. tacked to the S.E. one sail in sight at 7 h. spoke the Ship Edmonica of New Bedford. Capt. Howland two months out one whole 125 Bbls. S. Peil Am continues fair tacked several times between Becaria and Graciosa saw grampuses several times the Edmonica in sight this ends Mr Joseph below of duty

Sunday Aug 19th

The fore part fair with light breezes from the N.E. Ship heading W. ward at 5 h. the ship Visper of New London Capt. Hemstedt came down and spoke us & came on board. she is 30 days out 20 Bbls. fish oil. Am weather continues fair with light breezes from N.E. Ship heading to the N.W. at 11 h. tacked to the E. ward at noon Pico bore per compass S.E. by S. Dist about 25 miles this ends 2 sail in sight Mr Joseph below of duty

Remarks

Monday Aug 20th

Pm pleasant weather with light breezes from the N.E. Ship heading E. ward at 4 h Pm Pico bore S.W. Dist 20 miles. Am calm and light airs from the West ward Ship steered E. ward with all sail out at noon the Point of St. George about 18 miles Dist this ends people variously employed Mr Joseph below of duty
